Will and Rudi at this year's Junior Open Agility World Championships

After their success in winning gold at last year's Junior Open Agility World Championships in Finland, the pair had a lot to live up to at this year's event when representing Team GB on home soil. The setting was the magnificent Dallas Burston Polo Club in Warwickshire.

The competition in which Will and Rudi were defending their world title was the Team Agility. The competition consists of 2 rounds where all 4 handlers in each team run. The best 3 runs for each team in each round are counted.

Will & Rudi lined up alongside Taylor & Elliott, Max & Woody and Amelie & Dex to represent Team GB.

The first round was a jumping round and Will and Rudi went clear as did two of his teammates with one pair getting 5 faults which was the score that was discounted. So the team took 0 faults through to the second round and were in 2nd place behind the German team on time.

The second round (agility) is run in reverse order of placing so GB were second to last to go. They knew that clear rounds were essential to put pressure on the German team who would go last. The team ran beautifully with no sign of nerves - unlike parents, management, team mates and spectators on the sidelines! The team put in 4 clear rounds out of 4, meaning the German team had to repeat that in a quicker time to win overall.

They couldn't do it and three of their team had faults meaning GB won and were crowned as Under 19 World Champions for 2023.

The GB team as a whole had their best ever results in a junior championship with 5 golds and 12 medals in total. It

was a fantastic experience and the support that team mates gave each other definitely made a big difference to their performance.

This is Will's last year as a junior and probably Rudi's last year of competition before he takes the most well deserved of retirements so it was a lovely way for the pair to sign off their Junior Team GB career.

Your password has been reset

These are words you may not want to read, especially if you haven't requested a change. It will either be your emails have been hacked into, or more often, the email server has decided you should change your "out-of-date" password and has done it for you!

You may not believe this but some people still use the word "password" and "12345678" as a means of accessing emails or sensitive files and as most servers require a password to consist of at least 8 alpha numeric characters both upper-case and lower-case letters and a symbol, it is hardly surprising changes are being imposed.

When visiting several clients recently, they've been in the belief they don't have a password to access emails, which means someone installed their system without informing them of how it was set up, or their recording of passwords is taken from the Heath Robinson guide to office management. (A reference only those of a certain age will be aware.)

Which brings me to the main point. Many people will be thinking of buying a new computer, if not now, certainly in the near future! Those who choose a windows-based system will find Microsoft has users tied in knots as they have changed a simple installation into a system designed to hog tie users into becoming Microsoft's revenue stream. There is no such thing as a free lunch on the internet and if you follow Microsoft's recommendations you will be paying a very high price, constantly!

To help keep your sanity when installing windows 11 for the first time, avoid all the Microsoft's recommendations and click on the opposite or other solutions. You will know what I mean when you see it! You will be able to activate any of these recommendations at a later time if you wish, but it will sidestep installing, one drive, office 365 or a host of apps, all designed to take money from you!

...and don't think it would be better to buy an Apple or Mac-book, the hardware is almost identical to a PC, but often 3 times more expensive. (A couple of years ago, Apple had a cash reserve in excess of \$2billion dollars and it could well be much more now!)

I offer a free service to those wishing to buy a new system. Before buying it, let me know the make and model of computer you've chosen, I'll give an honest opinion on its performance. Not all systems perform equally and the same model could be cheaper from a different supplier. I don't sell new computers only repair or refurbish them. But I do know some new computers are old stock, just not yet sold. If buying a new computer which has windows 10 and ready to upgrade to windows 11, it's at least 18 months old. Windows 11 was release in October 2021 and all manufacturers were instructed to stop installing windows 10 at that time! Windows 10 will be retired in the autumn of 2025.

PA23/04488 – Change of use, conversion and extension of disused agricultural barn to 1 x dwelling. Bowdah Barn, Week St Mary. Councillors proposed to make no comment on the plans.

PA23/04872 – New build garage for four cars with adjoining ground floor tool shed with first floor games room over and an adjoining greenhouse. Regent House, Week St Mary. Councillors felt that it was a large development. As the heritage issue was raised in the public participation section of the meeting, it was felt that the parish council needs evidence that the proposed building does not affect anything. Councillors proposed to object to the application, as they had not seen enough evidence of the heritage impact.

PA23/04306 – Development comprising the delivery of a ground mounted solar farm alongside associated infrastructure including distribution substation upgrades with the capacity to deliver approximately 42MW of renewable energy.

Land north of Canworthy Water.

It was proposed for Week St Mary Parish Council to make no comment at this point, but to ask for an extension to the consultee period. The clerk to get in touch with Nicky Chopak on the matter, to keep everyone in the loop.

Chocolate Chip Muffin

Ingredients

9 oz / 255g Plain Flour
3 teaspoons / 15ml Baking Powder
½ teaspoon / 2.5ml Salt
3 - 4 ozs / 85-110g White Caster Sugar
1 Egg
8 fl ozs / 240ml Milk
3fl ozs / 50ml Vegetable Oil
3 ozs / 85g Chocolate Chips or Chunks [Milk or Plain]
Add 1 teaspoon / 5ml Vanilla Essence flavouring to wet the ingredients

Method

- Prepare muffin tins with muffin cases. Preheat oven to 375-400 deg F / 190-200 deg C / Gas mark 5-6.
- In a large bowl, sift together, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar.
- In a separate bowl, beat egg with a fork, stir in the milk, followed by the oil.
- 4 Pour all of liquid ingredients into the dry mixture. Stir just until combined, scraping sides and bottom of the bowl as you stir. Add chocolate chips and mix for about 30 seconds. The batter will be lumpy but no dry flour should be visible. Do not over-stir.
- Fill muffin cases, three quarters full. Bake for 20-25 minutes, until tops are lightly browned and spring back when pressed gently. Allow muffins to cool for several minutes to make removal easier.

CHILDREN'S COMPETITON

Peanut Butter Cookies

Ingredients

200g smooth peanut butter 175 g granulated sugar 1 large egg

Method

- 1 Heat oven to 180C / 160C Fan / Gas mark 4 and line two large baking trays with baking parchment.
- 2 Measure the peanut butter and sugar into a bowl. Add the egg and mix until the mixture forns a dough.
- 3 Break off cherry tomato sized chunks of dough and place, well spaced apart, on the tray. Press the cookies with the back of a fork to squash them a little. The cookies can now be frozen fo 2 months, if desired but add an extra minute or two to the cooking time.
- 4 Bake for 12 minutes, until golden around the edges and paler in the centre. Cool on the tray for 10 minutes, the transfer to a wire rack and cool completely. Store in a cookie jar for up to 3 days.
