





coming from their properties. Now the Trust provides funds for those in need. They also fund education - Budehaven school library was funded by Blanchminster. The trust provides grants to university students, grants towards 6th form studies, special needs, sewing groups, music groups, etc. all based in and around Bude/Stratton. The group meets once a month but can provide emergency funding in between these meetings. The meeting was extremely interesting and a lot was learnt about this very good organization. We were even treated to seeing Chris dressed up in chain mail.

In June we welcomed Chris Nichols who is the Chief Stockwarden of the Blanchminster

Trust which is based in Bude – described by Chris as a suburb of Stratton. The Blanchminster trust is the oldest grant giving charity in Britain and possibly in the world. There is a book written in Old English that gives information on the trust. The title Stockwarden comes from the historical role of looking after the stock (i.e. animals) they were kept in what is now Poundfield. Records start 1421 but the trust probably goes back as far back as 1100. There are remains of the square moat just down from Lidl which was thought to be the first settlement. The first Ranulph de Blanchminster went off to the crusades and was reported as being killed, his wife remarried but he was still alive. Second Sir Ranulph a bit of a scoundrel who married Isobel, heiress of Scilly Isles, now had Stratton and the rent of 300 puffins from the Scilly Isles. Their son married a girl with the surname of Wake which is possibly where Week came from. Here the line ended and normally the riches would have passed back to the crown but at this point the trust was set up and administered by the church. In 1421 Poppy's field was acquired which is a large area of Bude including the triangle and the area up from Barclays Bank and much of King Street - most of which still belongs to the Trust. The Trust had three specific purposes armour and equipment for the king, relief of the poor and defence of the parish. In 1588 word of the Spanish Armada was take to London from Stratton by horses paid for by the Trust. The south aisle of St Andrews church was paid for by Blanchminster as was the pillory and ducking stool! Stratton was one of the first areas to inoculate against smallpox. John Cotton being the first at a cost of 7s 6d. The Trust owns a lot of property in Bude and does not fund raise, their income

The cost of AI is to be felt by everyone!

Much is being said about AI and it is a very exciting, concerning and an uncertain time as artificial intelligence is FORCED upon us.

The upshot of all this is most computers, not built within the past 5 years, will not work on the new software, and possibly later models will not be able to handle Ai either, but that's a wait and see!

Microsoft has already released Bing Chat and ChatGBT and is planning to release an Ai assistant called 'Co-pilot' which will be capable of analysing texts and images without opening the browser, answering specific contextual questions, and even controlling your systems settings. There are other features in the pipeline as always with Microsoft some of these fixes are to fix things which are not broken! Also, Microsoft's Chatbox is designed to promote advertising, if wanting to test ChatGPT sign into <u>https://www.openai.com</u>, it is particularly good and no adverts!

From October of this year, Windows 10 machines built before 2017 will cease to provide satisfactory functionality as updates and patches will stop being sent out. Some printers and scanners are already failing to function correctly as drivers become incompatible with the new software.

People will become frustrated with their none working systems and millions will dispose of them in recycling centres. But, don't rush out and buy a new one, newly bought machines can be 18 months old as they have travelled the high seas for 6 months, or more, or stuck in a distributors warehouse as sales have dropped. Some video and graphic drivers may need to be updated as improved Video morphing will become a new plaything in Laptops, Tablets and Phones. "You ain't seen nothing yet!" Was one comment I received when discussing it recently.

All very exciting and very dangerous, hackers are ahead of the game and legislation is likely to be as toothless as ever. Enjoy the ride, but it could be very bumpy! Beware the elaborate cons, there are plenty, and some will be truly horrendous!
