

Living in an isolated village many miles from major hospitals, and with over 70% of cardiac arrests occurring at home and about half being witnessed by a bystander, why not start the year with a resolution to learn these important skills which could save a life! Quick intervention can be the difference between life and death.

In the UK there are over 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests annually, 12 people under 35 die each week from cardiac arrest and it could simply happen to **ANYONE** of us at **ANY TIME**. WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES W.I.

How would you like to live in a country where success is measured by happiness and quality of life rather than wealth? Our February speaker, Rosemary Lee, was lucky to have visited such a country – Bhutan. This is a small Himalayan kingdom twice the size of Wales sandwiched between Tibet and India and one of the most mountainous countries in the world. The highest mountain is just under 25,000 ft with 19 other peaks over 23,000ft. Historically it is one of few countries never conquered by an outside power. However, it was often threatened by Tibet and so turned to the British Raj in India for protection. After independence in 1947, India continued with its protection and Bhutan receives India's largest donation of foreign aid.

It is difficult for us to accept that the first proper road was built in 1962 which was just a muddy jeep track and, although tarmac was added in the 1980's, it was still single-track. Work to make this two-lane started in 2015 and is now complete but is still dangerous with a national speed limit of 30 mph and no traffic lights. The first airport was opened in 1968 but only for emergency helicopters. This is still the only international airport but, as it is "the most dangerous in the world" only 24 pilots are licensed to land there. There are now 3 other airports but only for domestic flights.

Geographically the country is made up of a series of steep glaciated valleys running from north to south, making communication and travel almost impossible. Hence each valley had its own ruler who combined the role of religious and state ruler. Bhutan has only been unified since 1885, with the help of the British Raj, ruled by a King. The national religion is Tantric/ Tibetan Buddhism and the highest lama in the land holds a position equal to the King. The fourth king came to power in 1972, aged 16 years old, and brought in modern education and healthcare, developed roads, hydro-electric power and tourism. He abdicated in 2006 in favour of his son so that his country could move to a constitutional monarchy.

It was this king who started the philosophy of Gross National Happiness rather than Gross National Product which was rooted in Bhutan's Buddhist legal code which stated that "**if the government cannot create happiness for its people, then there is no purpose for the government to exist**". This philosophy includes protection of the environment which means that hunting and fishing are illegal, the felling of trees only under strict licence, and the climbing of the highest peaks (where spirits may dwell) is strictly forbidden. Also, smoking and other tobacco products were banned from sale in 2004;

and cleanliness is very important with roads regularly swept, toilets cleaned and tourist facilities often inspected.

Other interesting facts:

- electricity is generated from hydro power and 45% of national income comes from the sale of electricity to India.
- farms are small 4-5 acres only and they produce rice in paddy fields. Hence lots of chillies are grown to provide some seasoning!
- 70% of the country is covered by forest, mainly coniferous on the valley sides.
- not much wildlife, some Macaque monkeys and Grey Langurs. The national animal is the Takin, like a cow/goat mix?
- national sport is archery – target at 435 ft; darts is for the poorer people – target 60 ft! (played with a large heavy dart)

Finally, the most common form of burials is “sky burials”. Bodies are taken to a high place, dismembered and left for the birds to consume. The memorial to the dead is a white flag erected near the village where the deceased lived. As long as it survives, it is a memorial: once it fades and shreds in the wind, so the memories fade. However, the Buddhists do believe in reincarnation.

The photograph shows our speaker in front of the Tiger’s Nest monastery, the most holy in the country because it was built around a cave where the Tibetan monk who brought Buddhism to Bhutan meditated in the 8th century. First built in 1692, destroyed by fire in 1998 but rebuilt in 2005.





Cllr Slade extended thanks to Cllr Gubbin and Cllr Richardson for moving the speed indicator sign. She had received a call from South West Water asking if the village was happy with the water pressure. As far as she was aware, people seemed happy at the moment. Apparently, there is a leak somewhere in the village, which SWW are trying to find. She also reported that the salt bin at the top of the hill had been filled. Cllr Gubbin said the pothole situation needs looking at. He said the council could save money on the time and the number of workers sent out to repair potholes. Cllr Slade said the ditch from Broad Close to Delabole Head and from North Park to Goscott Corner needs sorting. Cllr Richardson said a 30mph sign concrete base has been pulled out of the ground at Stewarts Road. Cllr May said there was a huge flood on the blind bend from Greenamoor Cross to Whitstone. The clerk reported that the footpath repair that had been carried out outside Week Green is not the responsibility of Highways, but Cornwall Housing. She will go back to Cornwall Housing to say the council is not happy with how the footpath has been left.

With nationally 1 in 7 people being unable to communicate effectively with the internet/email/online banking system, it is little wonder why our team is fully stretched to help. We have a policy of helping every genuine request for help. One of the main lessons we have learnt from our visits is that many local people were unaware of us, or the areas in which we can help, and especially the direct contact we have with some agencies, like SouthWest Water or Cornwall Council about council tax problem

A hint of things to come, or maybe it's here already!

BT has commenced its copper cable shutdown with 135 postcode areas being the first to be totally switched off, none of these are in this area, but it soon will be, by mid-2027 all areas will have been converted to fibre optic Voice over the internet and the old landline service will be discontinued. Those who haven't upgraded should do so if they want to keep their phone system operational. Being without a phone can be can put you at risk! Sadly, one such case has recently caused the death one elderly gentleman.

Recently I experienced a blockage on the landline allowing outgoing calls to be made, but incoming calls were redirected to a voice mail server. I could collect the messages by dialling 1571, that is if any of the callers chose to leave a message. Several incoming calls were ultimately missed.

BT eventually admitted it is necessary to switch off and reboot the broadband router as a high volume of data traffic through the system can cause part of the system to malfunction. When this happens, the broadband router should be rebooted, (switched off and switched back on again) as the Voice over the internet is becoming overloaded with data, switching off the router, then restarting it should ideally be done every 2 weeks to refresh the system. As all landlines will be switched to this system next year, it is something worth remembering.

Now if you think your password is safe or your system is encrypted, time to consider this. For the past two decades Computer Engineers have been working on Quantum Computers which are far faster than any super computer of today. Also, the new supporting quantum software will be so advanced it will consign AI to the scrap heap. You may think, So what? But consider this quantum software can break down binary code into smaller segments called "qubits" and these can be reconstructed to rewrite any password or decrypt any encrypted program and create a language so complex no human can understand or decode.

Microsoft, Google, Meta, Apple and many others are all involved at one level or another in Quantum Computer development and when it is refined, not even the Banks or Stock Markets will be safe from quantum attacks! The value of currency or corporate stocks will be at risk and the only safe commodities will be gold and silver.

Microsoft has changed the name of its office software to Microsoft 365 Copilot app. Copilot being Microsoft's venture into AI programming and guess what, the annual subscription has increased! The free Libre Office is a very good alternative without cost and the interference of a co-pilot.
