





We agreed at our recent Chapel business meeting to explore the feasibility of extending our premises into the courtyard to build a community coffee shop/lounge. It would also support

Scammers don't care, they will take everything from you!

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) at the City of London Police and Action-Fraud have reported they are receiving in excess of 850,000 reports of fraudulent scams each year and there are an equal number if not more that go unreported, and with AI it is getting worse!!!

A new one, or should I say an old one with a new twist is jobs working from home. Adverts in social media want people with selected skills to apply for a job, where the individual can earn up to £30,000 plus bonuses a year. There is no upfront investment and all documentation is original and correct, the applicant is tasked with some jobs, which are easily complied with and a bonus structure is commenced.

Here's the rub! The applicant now has to provide their bank and personal details to get payment. Guess what? Correct! no payment only withdrawals.

One such victim lost £18,000.

Some might say they would never get caught out as they are too careful, but a professional con man or woman can work you until you believe anything they tell you.



AN AIRBNB host has warned of being scammed out of £2,000.

Individuals are renting accommodation through Airbnb and making spurious comments and complaints regarding the accommodation and either failing to pay or demanding a refund. Basically, this is blackmail as the renter threatens to make unjustified and derogatory comments on respective social media platforms, the bad publicity is more damaging than giving a refund! Report any such occurrences to the Police.

LASTPASS users warned about a phishing email

This scam asks LastPass users to update their password or account details through a link to a fake login page. These emails are very convincing and use the same logos and branding as the real LastPass emails and are produced to a very high standard and one can be easily fooled!

In all cases don't become hurried and check the website where the email is being sent from. Have a competent email security software in place and do not respond to a SMS or email requesting your personal data.


