WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES W.I.

Don't throw it away if it can be repaired! This was the message from our speakers to members and guests at our September meeting. Miranda Clarke and Alan Smith spoke to us about Bude Repair Cafe which is based in Neetside Community Centre. The Centre was opened in 1996 with over 50 organisations represented. The idea for a Cafe itself was discussed by 3 like-minded people in 2018. 30 volunteers turned up at a meeting in December and the Cafe opened its doors in February 2019. Since it opened 33 sessions have been held, 554 items have been brought in by over 100 people with 372 items fully repaired.

Customers discuss their items at Reception where they will be triaged so that they can be referred to the appropriate adviser – there are about 30 currently. The advisers are keen to show how the repair is being carried out to encourage self-help. Equally, they will advise if either more specialist knowledge is needed or if the item is irreparable. Customers wait in the Cafe with hot drinks and cakes available for free. Some customers to the Cafe don't have anything to repair they just appreciate the company (and cake) and they are also welcomed. There is a lot of collaboration between the Advisers and a sharing of tools. There are no charges but customers are asked to pay for new parts and donations are welcomed.

The idea of a Repair Cafe came from Martine Postma who organised the first one in Amsterdam on 18th October 2009. Following its success the Repair Cafe International Foundation was set up in 2011. There are currently 3,740 Cafes worldwide, even in India and Japan, with 56,100 volunteers involved. It is estimated that 67,320 items are repaired each month. The reason behind Repair Cafes is that we throw away a vast amount of stuff. Even things with almost nothing wrong which could get a new lease of life after a simple repair. The trouble is that lots of people have forgotten that they can repair things themselves. Especially, younger generations no longer know how to do that. Knowing how to make repairs

is a skill quickly lost. This is a threat to a sustainable future and to the circular economy in which raw materials can be reused again and again. People with repair skills get the appreciation they deserve and invaluable practical skills are passed on. Things are being used for longer and don't have to be thrown away. This reduces the volume of raw materials and energy needed to make new products because it cuts CO2 emissions being released.

The Repair Cafe is open on the last Saturday of the month from 10.00 am to 1.00 pm.

The date of the next regular meeting is **Thursday 9th October at 7.00 pm** for **7.30 pm start** which will be held in the **Methodist School Room.** The speaker will be from the Cornico Coffee Co. All members and lady guests will be welcome.

Standing Orders were suspended to allow Linda Cobbledick from the community shop to speak. She said around 14 attended the AGM. There are plans to renew the lease. Based on footfall, there will be a restructuring of staffing, reducing it from 33 paid hours to 27, and there will be shorter opening times if needed. In 2017, there were 861 customers a week, now it is 566 a week. Without more volunteers, it can't continue. On February 28 there was a

projected loss of £1,666, £1,000 was received from the parish council and £150 from Meet and Ear leaving a net loss of £516. Next year, with the rise in the National Living Wage, there is a projected loss of £2,200. They have turned off one freezer to reduce costs, and a £500 donation was received for repairs and renewals. She asked if the parish council could look at a donation of £1,250 to keep the community shop afloat. Linda said the Post Office doesn't belong to the shop so it makes no difference. She said 99 per cent of the people that use the Post Office do not spend a penny in the shop. She encouraged as many people as possible to attend the meeting in the parish hall on September 25 at 7pm. Cllr Slade extended thanks to the community shop staff and volunteers for what they do.

2. Footpath project

Cllr Slade said she would like to pick up the footpath project now. The path is not the correct width for the disabled. It was suggested that the council tarmacs over what it has got and extend to the correct width. The lower area and slip way will also need something. She asked councillors if they come across any grants for outside spaces online to bring back to the table. Councillors resolved that they were happy for the project to continue.

3. Ashbury Grove

Plans for the transfer of the land are in the hands of a solicitor.

4. Football club lease

The lease is also in the hands of the council's appointed solicitor.

A change of heart from Microsoft

Microsoft will not now end support for Windows 10 previously planned for October 14, 2025 only if your Microsoft account is sync'd to the cloud. Adding a Microsoft account to Windows 10 will extend support until October 13, 2026.

If you don't want to link a Microsoft account, you can either pay \$30 for a local account or use 1000 Microsoft reward points if you have them.

Windows 10 support was originally supposed to end on October 14, 2025 and previously, Microsoft confirmed that consumers could pay \$30 and get updates for an additional year.



This meant those who wouldn't pay wouldn't be eligible for Windows 10's monthly security updates, and that would have left millions of PCs vulnerable to security threats.

Microsoft understands users need time to buy a new PC, especially if Windows 11 is not supported on their existing computer. If you want to keep using Windows 10 for another year, but don't want to pay \$30 for extended support, link to your Microsoft account and will also allow every user to sign-up for free updates starting August 2025.

Domestic users Must use settings or the on-screen wizard to enrol in service, which is free if using Windows Backup or you must otherwise pay Microsoft the equivalent of \$30.

Businesses & Organizations which hold a volume license or who use cloud providers must pay \$61 per device for year 1 then double every year up to the following 3 years.

Cloud & Virtual PC users (Windows 365, Azure) Updates re automatically free with a valid subscription.

Clearly Microsoft's Windows 11 upgrade efforts have failed and extending support, want something in return. Either linking to a Microsoft account or paying \$30.

(Now that's what I call profiteering!)

However, some retailers are selling old stock which may not may not have the current Windows 11 24H2 version installed. This version requires a minimum 4GB memory to operate correctly, laptops with only 4 GB of memory will have little or no spare memory to operate 3rd party add-ons such as printers, scanners and office systems and will become slow

or freeze when doing so. Beware retailer bargains they may not be as beneficial as the sales person makes out! (check out system specifications before buying).

I have a small quantity of refurbished tower computers with Windows 11 installed and will gift these to OAP's experiencing financial difficulties free of charge (this offer does not include keyboard or monitors). Some conditions apply and to avoid fake applications, a sponsor will be required, although parental consent will not be necessary. Collection is also free but a small charge may be made for delivery and data transfer. Please telephone me in the first instance for all details.
