Chocolate Chip Muffin


Ingredients

```
9 oz / 255g Plain Flour
3 teaspoons / 15ml Baking Powder
½ teaspoon / 2.5ml Salt
3 - 4 ozs / 85-110g White Caster Sugar
1 Egg
8 fl ozs / 240ml Milk
3fl ozs / 240ml Vegetable Oil
3 ozs / 85g Chocolate Chips or Chunks [Milk or Plain]
Add 1 teaspoon / 5ml Vanilla Essence flavouring to wet the ingredients
```

Method

- 1 Prepare muffin tins with muffin cases. Preheat oven to 375-400 deg F / 190-200 deg C / Gas mark 5-6.
- 2 In a large bowl, sift together, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar.
- 3 In a separate bowl, beat egg with a fork, stir in the milk, followed by the oil.
- 4 Pour all of liquid ingredients into the dry mixture. Stir just until combined, scraping sides and bottom of the bowl as you stir. Add chocolate chips and mix for about 30 seconds. The batter will be lumpy but no dry flour should be visible. Do not over-stir.
- 5 Fill muffin cases, three quarters full. Bake for 20-25 minutes, until tops are lightly browned and spring back when pressed gently. Allow muffins to cool for several minutes to make removal easier.

CHILDREN'S COMPETITON

Peanut Butter Cookies

Ingredients

200g smooth peanut butter 175 g granulated sugar 1 large egg

Method

- 1 Heat oven to 180C / 160C Fan / Gas mark 4 and line two large baking trays with baking parchment.
- 2 Measure the peanut butter and sugar into a bowl. Add the egg and mix until the mixture forns a dough.
- 3 Break off cherry tomato sized chunks of dough and place, well spaced apart, on the tray. Press the cookies with the back of a fork to squash them a little. The cookies can now be frozen fo 2 months, if desired but add an extra minute or two to the cooking time.
- 4 Bake for 12 minutes, until golden around the edges and paler in the centre. Cool on the tray for 10 minutes, the transfer to a wire rack and cool completely. Store in a cookie jar for up to 3 days.

Professional Cyber Security support is often costly and for many SME's, sole traders, local charities and voluntary groups, obtaining such assistance can be well beyond their financial means.

These regional CRC's have been set up by Government to help groups and organisations who find themselves in just this position.

Much of what is on offer to you from the CRC is absolutely free.

Careless Browsing will cost more than you think!

I was recently asked to resolve an issue where a customer's bank account had restricted access placed on it as the Bank's security system detected a potential threat of an intrusion from the customers computer.

Now this is not the first time this issue has been raised, but invariably it comes from corporate accounts and not related to personal accounts, until now!

Bankers are on edge, not only from the massive number of viral attacks, money laundering and recent bad publicity, but from the added threat of Artificial Intelligence, it should be renamed 'Advanced Intelligence'. Because this technology will outpace the smartest of programmers and will have us all controlled in one way or another very soon if not controlled.

Having cleaned the customers system of infected files I could report to the bank a deep clean had been conducted and infected files found had been destroyed. On this occasion, the

customer has Avast Premium installed, yet I located 106 infected files, which I quarantined and destroyed (therefore need to question the validity of Avast).

I am constantly asked how infections like this happen and there can only be one answer and it's 'Careless Browsing' and poor-quality anti-virus software.

Please remember, just because you are paying a premium price for anti-virus protection, you may not get a premium service!

Scammers have now incorporated AI into their telephone scams and can clone any voice to make the scam more credible. It also has an intelligence



to respond to questions and give logical answers. If you find yourself caught up in a telephone conversation that you've not requested and the voice on the line sounds genuine and honest, stop the call by asking them to send to you an email with their business address and all the details they have given you, if they persist or will not send you the details, THEN IT'S A SCAM!

Do not let it panic you into thinking you've had your bank account compromised or threatened with a scam attack. You are 100% more likely to lose everything by following its suggestions, than you would by ignoring it completely.


