





COFFEE & WALNUT CAKE

Ingredients

250g Butter: 225g / 8oz caster sugar: 4 large eggs: 225g / 8oz self raising flour: ½ level teaspoon baking powder: 1 tbsp instant coffee, dissolved in 1 tablespoon of boiling water: 50g / 1¾oz walnuts, finely chopped.

For the filling and topping

125g / 4 ½oz butter, softened: 225g / 8oz icing sugar, sifted: 1 tablespoon instant coffee, dissolved in 1 tablespoon of boiling water 8 walnut halves to decorate

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Lightly butter two deep loose-bottomed 20cm/8in round tins and line the bases with baking paper.

- 1. Put the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder and coffee in a large mixing bowl and beat together (using an electric hand whisk if you have one) until well combined and smooth. Fold in the walnuts.
- 2. Divide the mixture evenly between the tins. Level the surface using a spatula or the back of a spoon.
- 3. Bake for 25-28 minutes, or until an inserted skewer comes out clean. Leave the cakes to cool in the tins for 5 minutes, then run a small palette knife or rounded butter knife around the edge of the tins and carefully turn the cakes out onto a wire rack. Peel off the paper and leave to cool completely.
- 4. For the filling and topping, beat the butter and gradually add the icing sugar. Add the coffee and beat until smooth.

5. Choose the cake with the best top, then put the other cake upside-down onto a serving plate and spread with half the coffee icing. Sandwich together with the other half. Ice the top of the cake and decorate with the walnut pieces to serve.

POTATO, CHEESE AND ONION PIE using Shortcrust Pastry – Any Recipe

CHEESE & THYME BISCUITS

160g plain flour: 100g cold butter: 1 egg

100g finely grated cheddar;

½ tsp dried thyme

Method

- 1. Heat oven to 180c/160c fan/gas 4. Put the flour in a bowl and rub in the butter until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the cheese and thyme, then add the beaten egg a little at a time and mix using a fork. When the mix starts to clump together, use fingers to knead to a smooth dough.
- 2. Roll into a sausage shape approx 20cm long them cut into 1cm slices. Place on one or two baking trays. Flatten slightly with a fork then bake for approx. 15 mins. or until firm. Cool slightly before placing on a wire tray to cool completely. Will keep for up to 1 week in an airtight container. These are better prepared the day before.

Ingredients

225g/8oz self-raising flour 75g/2½oz caster sugar 1 tsp baking powder 125g/4½oz butter, cut into cubes 150g/5½oz dried fruit (raising su

150g/5½oz dried fruit (raisins, sultanas or currants)

1 egg

1 tbsp milk

Method

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4

Mix the flour, sugar and baking powder in a bowl and rub in the cubed butter until the mixture looks like breadcrumbs, then mix in the dried fruit.

In a clean bowl, beat the egg and milk together

Add the egg mixture to the dry ingredients and stir with a spoon until the mixture just comes together as a thick, lumpy dough. Add a teaspoon more milk if you need it to make the mixture stick together.

Place spoonfuls of the mixture onto the prepared baking tray. Leave space between them as they will flatten and spread out to double their size during baking. Bake for 15–20 minutes, until golden-brown. Allow to cool for a couple of minutes, then turn them out onto a wire rack to cool.



11. Community Infrastructure Levy and Community Benefit Fund applications

Councillors discussed an application from Bright Sparks – to extend stage, guard rails and backdrops. Councillors noted the process with the timings to consider grants, and agreed to vary the process on this occasion due to time restraints of the project.

Councillors proposed to grant the £1,000 from the Community Benefit fund.

Before the agenda items were discussed, Cllr Slade reminded everyone that proposals have to be proposed, seconded and resolved in order for the resolution to happen.

To get this off the ground we set up crowdfunding as we need to buy annual Insurance and maintain the site for all to enjoy. We are allowing dogs to this ancient site on leads.

New UK laws aimed at protecting children online

Regulating harmful content online came into effect on July 25, 2025. These laws, part of the Online Safety Act, require online platforms to implement measures to prevent children from accessing harmful content, including pornography, self-harm material, and other age-inappropriate content. Key aspects are:

Child Protection:

"Highly effective age assurance" must be applied.

Harmful Content Regulation:

Harmful content, i.e. self-harm, suicide and eating disorders must be monitored.

Transparency and Control:

Greater transparency on content to give users more control over what they see.

Enforcement:

Greater enforcement powers given to Ofcom to regulate content.

Age Verification:

Pornography sites must use robust age verification apps.

Parents and Children:

Parents to have more tools to protect children online.

Adult Users:


Adult users to have more control over available content.

Potential for Blocked Content:

Some websites may be blocked for UK users.

Evolving Technology:

The effectiveness of age verification tools to be monitored. However, the use of VPNs can bypass age verification measures as logging into foreign websites and the dark web is relatively easy. Many websites have little care on who views its content only that it brings in advertising revenue.



Some of these regulations may also breach personal data privacy laws and may not be applied as they can breach the data protection act! (that law may need to be changed).

The new laws mean well, but the law of unintentional consequences is apparent.

Talk about locking the stable door after the horse has bolted, the government is so far behind the curve, many of these laws will have no effect on tech savvy kids!! The new laws also affect what you may write on social media any breach of these laws can result in a criminal prosecution, be very careful, voicing a simple opinion can be life changing and you won't just be waving goodbye to freedom of speech.
