

WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES W.I.

ORANGUTANS SHARE 96.45% OF HUMAN DNA and can live up to 45-50 years old. This is what we learnt at our March meeting from Vet Nigel Hicks and his wife Nurse Sara Fell Hicks who have been working in the UK for over 50 years. In 2009 they went to Borneo with an English charity working with orangutans for 5 years, 6 months at a time, in government rescue centres. However, they realised that there was no chance of those animals being re-wilded. Through their experiences they also recognised a need for the provision of veterinary equipment, medicines and practical veterinary mentoring to orangutan rescue groups and rehabilitation centres in Indonesia and Malaysia. The south of the Island of Borneo belongs to Indonesia and is all deforested (ready for palm oil planting), very poor and with no support for the centres which are still rescuing animals every week. Orangutans are a critically endangered species and are only found on the islands of Borneo and Sumatra. There are 3 species with only 75,000 left in the world having decreased from a population of 300,000 in 1900.

Initially, through friends, they raised funds to enable them to buy equipment which they personally took out to Indonesia. It soon became obvious that a more formal structure was needed and in early 2014 Orangutan Veterinary Aid (OVAID) was established. OVAID is a zero salary, voluntary run charity, registered in Launceston and so far has donated half a million pounds. The charity supports vets working at the front line of orangutan rescue whether this is from illegal pet homes, human

Much and more needs to be said about AI

A few weeks ago, China declared heavy involvement in AI and America reacted badly! Their stock market lost a billion dollars.

The system they created is called DeepSeek, set up in 2023 in Hangzhou, China and is its first AI large language model. DeepSeek began to attract attention a couple of months ago and is competing against similar American models such as ChatGPT and OpenAI, but is more cost-effective and uses expensive Nvidia chips to train the system to adopt volumes of data. Recently, Apple and Google made the system accessible through there App stores.

But it was follow-up research a few weeks ago that caused the panic. It detailed another DeepSeek AI model called R1 which has advanced "reasoning" skills and the ability to rethink problems and is significantly cheaper than other systems.

If readers think AI is a new elaborate play thing, please think again, to register with DeepSeek you are required to accept adverts and trackers and disclose your personal data, this information like TikTok can be accessed by the Chinese authorities and a myriad of scammers whose only aim is to steal your money!

Now our government wants to make the UK a high-flying player in the AI world, but haven't planned on how the infostructure will be supported.

1st a location is required, about the size of 6 football fields, 2nd is the power it will need to run the data banks. "Bill Gates is building his own Power Station". The power required, based on current outputs, would leave London in a black out. So, a new power station would be required just to service AI data banks and that will take 10 years to build and who do you think is going to pay for it?

With a net zero policy the whole of Devon would need to be covered in glass to make the electricity to run it and the heat generated from the computers would cancel out any benefit of wind power!

Al is now no1 in the scammer's arsenal, fake images and cloned voices are just a few of the tricks being used. The more elaborate scams involve Bitcoin and large financial investment and politicians promises.

However, students can use AI to complete course work and

dissertations, meaning it may be possible to get a degree without the learning. Now that is frightening! Maybe the education authority will have to train teachers to use AI to look for repetitive text.

For free help and advice Tel: Brian Meadows 01288 381061 Nofix-Nofee Computer Services orangutan conflict, deforestation, habitat loss or illegal wildlife trade. These vets and their teams are often working in difficult, demanding and dangerous conditions with minimal equipment.

Recognising the importance of practical help Nigel and Sara both spend as much time as possible each year volunteering at and assisting Indonesian rescue centres and established a scholarship programme to allow Indonesian orangutan vets to travel to the UK to further increase their knowledge and skill sets. However, the scholarship programme ceased during the pandemic so the charity paid for in situ training in the centres. This has proved to be better as students pass on their knowledge to other locals. This training has seen an emphasis on dentistry which has become an important tool in improving the general health of the animals. More courses are also being held online. 




