Ruminations from the Rectory

The Housewife

Tony Campolo writes that his friend and prominent radio preacher Steve Brown eloquently described a housewife who was washing dishes in the kitchen sink one day after the children had left for school. She looked at one particular plate. She stared at it for a long time and asked over and over again, “How many times have I washed this plate? How many times have I dried it? How many times will I wash it and dry it again?” She then set down the plate, took off her apron, packed a few of her belongings, and left.

That night she called home to tell her husband that she was all right, but that she just could not come home again. From time to time, over the next several weeks, she would call just to see how her husband and children were doing. But she would never tell them where she was, nor accede to the pleas from her family to return.

The husband hired a detective to search for her, and after picking up a few leads, the detective tracked her down. She was in another state, living in a small apartment over a luncheonette where she had a job as a waitress. Her husband set out immediately to bring her home. When he found the place she was staying, he knocked on the door of her upstairs apartment. She opened the door, saw him, and did not say a word. She went into her bedroom, packed her belongings, and silently followed him out to the car. Then, in silence, he drove her back home.

Several hours later when the two of them were alone in their bedroom he finally spoke, and he asked her, “Why didn’t you come home before? Over the phone I begged you to return. Why didn’t you come?”

The wife answered, “I heard your words, but it wasn’t until you came for me that I realized how much you cared and how important I was to you.”

It can be said that though the prophets in the Old Testament section of the Bible may have tried to tell us about God’s love, we never really got the message until God showed up among us. The Bible puts it like this, The Word, (Jesus) became human and lived among us. We saw his glory – the glory that belongs to the only Son of the Father – and he was full of grace and truth. John’s gospel, chapter 1 verse 14. He broke into history and became one of us, and as one of us, showed us His love.

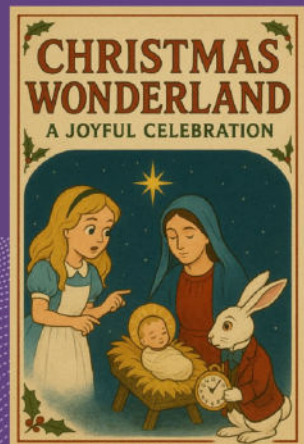

The Journey Begins!

Here we are at the end of November and I am asking you to prepare for the Journey of the Holy Family once more!

Advent Sunday this year is Sunday 30th November and this is the day that our Crib figures will start on their Journeys around Week St Mary as they head for Christmas Eve when they all meet together at our church crib. We will not be able to have a service in our own church that day but we will contact the first families to ensure the journey starts on time.

Last year we again had a really enthusiastic response to this simple idea to remind us of the true meaning of Christmas as it gently approaches throughout the season of Advent. We had more than 90 families and individuals in the village and around our Parish who welcomed the figures into their homes for one night.

Each family lights a candle beside their figures which are then displayed on a windowsill or similar place where they can be seen from outside. The next day they take the figures to the next host family in time for the next evening. We have three sets of figures, all on different routes; Mary and Joseph and the donkey, the Three Kings and the Shepherds. Obviously, we want to repeat the Journey this year and as last year, the figures will meet together at significant times during Advent.

WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES W.I.

By popular demand, our speaker last month was a return visit for Frances Stuart, an Ambassador for Lundy who came to talk about Lundy's most famous shipwreck, that of the HMS Montagu. This took place in 1906 but why were Captain Adair and the navigator Lieutenant Dathan court-marshalled?

HMS Montagu, the first of a new Duncan-class pre-dreadnought battleship of the Royal Navy was built in Devonport and launched in 1903. It weighed 14k tons and had a crew of 751. Built to counter a group of fast Russian battleships, HMS Montagu and her sister ships were capable of steaming at 19 knots making them the fastest in the world. It was deployed to the Bristol Channel while taking part in secret trials of what would become known as radio communication. It is important to remember that the Bristol Channel has the 2nd highest tide race in the world.

On 29th May 1906 she was anchored off Lundy, but could not pick up the messages from the test station, so the ship weighed anchor to steam to the Isles of Scilly. Heavy fog forced her to reverse course and steam back to North Devon after four hours, but her Navigator miscalculated the course, placing her some two miles off her original track. Montagu encountered a pilot cutter cruising in the vicinity of Lundy, slowed to a stop, and came alongside the cutter to request a distance and bearing for Hartland Point on the mainland. Though the cutter supplied these accurately, the voice from the battleship's bridge replied that they must be wrong and that the pilot cutter must have lost her bearings. Having ignored the advice at 2.12pm the ship hit rocks and wedged onto the rocky ledge of Shutter Point, Lundy. A small boat was lowered to try and find Hartland Point. At 5.40am, having found land, some crewmen climbed up the cliffs. If they had turned left at the top they would have discovered the southern lighthouse. Unfortunately, they turned right and marched the length of the island before they reached Lundy's northern lighthouse who had great difficulty in convincing the sailors that they were NOT at Hartland lighthouse. Eventually, a message was sent notifying Lloyd's Register for Shipping and a second message sent to the Admiralty. The sick men and valuables were removed from the ship and all the remaining crew were taken off. Miraculously, there were no fatalities.

An Admiral was in charge of the ensuing salvage, presumably because it was such an important ship. Initially, the salvage was carried out by Liverpool Salvage Company advising Admiral Sir Arthur Wilson but, as the operations were not very efficient, they were replaced in 1907 by the Western Marine Salvage Company of Penzance. A series of steps were cut into the cliff face to help with salvage operations – now known as the “Montagu” steps. A reinforced suspension bridge comprising of over 10 tons of material was taken from the ship to these cliff steps. This ensured that passage to the stricken vessel was possible in any weather and at

any state of the tide. Remarkably, the bridge was completed in just 32 hours. The company completed the salvage of the wreck for scrap metal over the next 15 years. The shipwreck made headline news and spectators came over from Devon and Wales. Photographers produced postcards which were sold in their hundreds.



The wreck was finally sold for £4,250 in January 1907. A total of £85k of goods was removed but an estimated £48k was lost due to the bottom half of the ship being underwater. The Admiralty announced that the total loss was £1.2k. The wreck is now a scheduled ancient monument but divers, ex servicemen supported by Help for Heroes, have been exploring the wreck. The Court Marshal blamed the thick fog and faulty navigation for the wreck. Captain Thomas Adair and the Navigator Lieutenant James Dathan were severely reprimanded with both men being dismissed from HMS Montagu. Dathan also lost 2 years of seniority in rank. The photograph shows HMS Montagu stranded on Shutter Point. We should remember that this was one of hundreds of wrecks around Lundy's coast.

The date of the next regular meeting is Thursday 11th December at 7.00 pm for 7.30 pm start which will be held in the Methodist School Room. This will just be a Christmas social meeting for members and any lady visitors with entertainment provided by a female shanty group, Figurehead.

Does your teenage child have a mobile phone, silly question I know. No teenager wouldn't be seen dead without one. So why this article? You may be aware your child uses YouTube, Instagram, TikTok, Messenger, Facebook.

Not sure? Would they tell you anyway?

There are over 25 popular Apps kids can use to chat or exchange content. So here are a few more you may not know about:

weBelong, Yubo, BeReal, F3, Dispo, iMessage Game, Poparazzi, Whisper, Lapse, Houseparty, Discord, Doublicat, Kik, Picsart and there are more regional ones, but this list is quite extensive and you think Parental controls monitor them? Some do and some don't.

Parents Need to Know:

Instagram is the second most popular app among 13-17-year-olds and experts found access to pornographic content easy to find, it is a serious problem on Instagram, but Facebook, owners of Instagram, know about this but suppress the data.



An internal study by an American Journal found that Instagram contributes to body image problems and undermines mental health, especially for teenage girls.

Facebook say Instagram features a variety of safety measures that parents can use to ensure their children's online security, such as age restrictions and account privacy settings.

There are several tools available for monitoring activity on the app including blocking or restricting certain accounts from appearing in searches or newsfeeds.

I once knew a family with a teenage daughter, now graduated out of university, but both arms were covered in a mass of scars. A stark reminder of the dangers of the Internet, let alone the threat of Paedophiles, or the encouragement that life is worthless, had the parents known things may have been different.
