We look forward to seeing as many members as possible from our 100 plus shareholders at the meetings.





#### Computer issues that can affect you now!

Recent Windows updates have caused some problems with some systems, I say this in this vaguest of terms as there is no consistency in these errors, only that the 'Blue Screen of Death' is displayed as each system tries to recover. If this happens to you, make a note of the error code displayed on the screen and let me know what it is. It could be a conflict with an application or invading virus, or

'adware'. I may be able to help resolve it before you run a reset

You may also need to run the recovery program and take the system back to a previous image, but don't be confused with a system reset. A system reset will reinstall windows, but also wipe out all 3<sup>rd</sup> party programs, which you would be forced to reinstall once the reset has completed.



WhatsApp has issued several warnings of late and these should not be ignored as hackers are sending out requests to access your phone using a 6-digit code. If you allow them access to your phone, the thieves will not only block you out of your own account, they will systematically attack all your contacts, steal yours and their data, then try to rob whatever they can from both you and them!



A few weeks ago, Google declared they had been hacked and over 50 million customer accounts had been stolen or compromised. Those using Google Pay should have been notified with details of what has happened. If you are a Google Pay user and have not changed your password recently, change them now!

Have you thought how easy it is to record your voice?

Voice chat is very much a thing of our time and people use TikTok, YouTube, Facebook and other platforms to tell the world about themselves, their products or their ideas, and that's great! But consider this. How easy is it for a thief to clone your voice!

Microsoft has created an AI tool called VALL-E. It can clone a person's voice in a few seconds and then generate audio in a wide range of different languages. A short audio clip of your, or a family member's voice can be stolen from any media platform and scammers can impersonate them.... and that's truly scary!!

Acorns has been running since 2001 and has enjoyed many years of success. However, there are a number of developments over the last few months which have led to this heart breaking decision; including the energy crisis, the national shortfall in government funding, pupil numbers and staffing . Unfortunately, these factors have led the committee to believe that continuing to run the preschool will not be financially viable.

#### Week St Mary Church Annual Gift Day Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> June


