





Week St Mary Bonaventures WI May Meeting

Martin Clunes coming to Week St Mary? Surely not! Almost is the answer. The majority of you have probably been watching our May speaker on television for the last 25 years. Paul Martin, a local man (no relation), appeared in the TV series "Doc Martin" for all 10 series filmed over a total of 22 years; firstly as an Extra and, in later years, as a body double for the Doc himself. Because he had been encouraged in his youth to take part in performances on stage, he applied for the part of an Extra as soon as he knew that a new TV series (as yet untitled) was due to be filmed in Port Isaac. He was accepted and so began his career as a TV and film extra.

Each episode took 4 months to film and not all episodes were filmed in Port Isaac – it was mainly used for outside shots. Indoor room sets were built in a barn near St Endellion and St Genny's was used for "Aunt Joan's" funeral. He was keen to emphasise that it was not all glamour! Extras are given 24 hours notice and often provide their own clothes. Filming was normally from 9am until late although actors would have been on set for hours for make up, instructions and rehearsals. It was often done in very cold weather with bright lights simulating sunshine although the actors had to be in summer clothes. Don't believe everything you see on screen!

Halfway through the series Paul started to take on the role as body double for Martin Clunes. This involved filming which did not show Martin's face. It included driving the Lexus car or sitting in the back seat for the wedding or single shots like providing an arm or hand. He also graduated to minor speaking or non speaking parts. At other times Paul was a body double for a stalker and a Policeman. Interesting points of interest were that children from Delabole School were used for non-speaking parts: speaking parts for minors were provided by stage schools and all children were exceptionally well looked after. Martin Clunes, well known for his love of animals, got on extremely well with Buddy (played by Dodger) but both actors got into character immediately when shooting started – the dog was a complete professional! It was a very happy set and all the actors were extremely friendly. Paul's wife, Donna, also joined him as an extra in the final series.

What is Sharenting and the dangers of Sharenting

Sharenting, is the practice of parents sharing pictures and videos of their children on social media. What many may not consider is that sharing information online can lead to embarrassment, bullying, or the misuse of that data by deep fake identity theft.

Al is the new plaything, but much of the data is 2 years out of date. As banks replenish its data it will harvest all existing and new data on social media from the last 2 years.

You may think, there is no harm in posting a few images of the new born or your child winning at rugby. But to the wider world such data is extremely useful!

Barclays Bank forecasts by 2030, publicly shared images will account for two-thirds of all identity fraud. Child identity fraud in US cost \$1 Billion dollars annually and it affects or involves 1 in 50 children, let alone the trauma and distress for all concerned.

Dangers of sharenting

1.Reveal too much about children to bad actors.

Videos and photos posted on social networks can be hijacked and used to create fake profiles and shared them with other strangers.

2.Childrens digital identity can be stolen

Thinking identity theft happens only to adults is wrong. A child's digital identity is pure gold to a cybercriminal as it is a "clean slate" no records or incidents are related to it.

3.Digital kidnapping.

This involves stealing images of a child and pretending the child is their own. Malicious acts like this can adversely affect the child, subject them to bullying or unwanted exposure.

4.Profiling could affect children in the long term

Using a child's data can have a serious adverse effect on their future, create a criminal record, affect their education, mental health or financial standing at a later time.

5.Online privacy and the right to create their own digital identity

The child's right to privacy maybe severely compromised

6.Turn off location services

Avoid uploading images with places that could reveal your location, e.g., in front of their house or school and turn off location services on your phone or computer.

Remember, be selective if sharing images with strangers and ensure all systems have endto-end encryption. Adjust social media accounts' privacy settings and restrict access to your content only those you know and prevent strangers from viewing images of your children.


VANDALISM IN THE VILLAGE





Letter of introduction from the new Rector Rev. David Saunders

Dear friends,

As you read this article, we may have already had the pleasure of meeting. On the 9th June I will be inducted and installed as Rector with oversight ministry for the benefice. For me, this will be my first role as an incumbent. My background is certainly not traditional; coming from the world of finance, working for 40 years in the insurance industry and rarely stepping into a church except for baptisms, weddings or funerals of friends and loved ones. It took a life changing event in 2013 to lead to my wife (Dianne) and I stepping into a church to join the congregation for the first time and question 'What is life all about?'. We spent our early life building our family, chasing promotions; success was measured in terms of possessions and wealth. But I was never fulfilled in my role; there was
