## WEEK ST MARY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council Meeting took place on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2011 under the chairmanship of Mr L Davies with 9 Councillors, Mr P Tucker Cornwall Councillor and 1 member of the public present. The following matters were discussed:

Ashbury Grove there are works pending; once completed, Cornwall Council will adopt the road. A "No dogs" sign will be put up beside the open space.

<u>Caravans</u>: Phil Tucker is still pursuing the caravans at the south end of the village. The caravan at the Lower Green is not a planning matter but Parish Council will keep a watching brief.

<u>Seat at Lower green</u>: Mr I Barriball has repaired the seat at the main green and will do the one at Lower Green this month <u>Review standing orders – model code of conduct</u> The Standards Board has now ceased to exist, and the Model Code of Conduct will be phased out end of 2011. Clerk to amend Standing Orders and the Complaints Procedure.

<u>Communications between Parish Councillors and parishioners</u> Ten years ago Councillors were known to the majority of parishioners, but an influx of new people means this is no longer the case. It was agreed to have photos of Councillors on the Parish Notice board.

<u>Forward planning: Queen's Diamond Jubilee 2012</u> Mr L Davies invites suggestions for the celebration, and will set up an open meeting September/October. Parish Hall Committee may consider wrapping the 40 years celebration in with the Diamond Jubilee event.

<u>Christmas tree</u> A new tree will be purchased and planted on the Green  $\underline{A}$ ll four trees will be lit up at Christmas and donations of spare lights are welcome

<u>Playing Field</u>: - A grant of £7400 has been won for play equipment for older children, which will be topped up from Council funds It was also agreed to purchase a "Saturn bouncer " for younger children to go alongside. The new pitch is greening, but needs re-seeding. Drainage is working well. A hut for changing facilities has now been sited. Thanks were voted for the work of the Football Club.
