Public Transport - Nothing to report

Community Policing – Devon & Cornwall police and Dorset police are looking at joining forces. **Playground/Playing Field** – The area and equipment has been inspected and all appears in order. Moles have been digging near the skateboard ramp and the Clerk was asked to contact Kilex to get rid of them. A large silver van has been seen parked near the entrance to the playing field and there is concern that it may make access for emergency vehicles difficult - this will be pointed out to the owner.

Highways, **Footpaths & Greens** – Weed spraying was apparently carried out mid-July but the weeds do not appear to be dying. The Clerk will contact Cormac and ask them to investigate. The seat on the hill has broken slats which could be dangerous. These slats will be removed and the Clerk will put a request in the magazine for anyone who is willing to repair the seat.

Mike Caesar-Gordon and Steve Cunningham attended the meeting on behalf of the Football Club to present a proposal for redevelopment of the tennis courts to provide additional facilities, with a surface that would also be suitable for other sports. Four different plans were under review. After discussion it was agreed that in principle this is a good idea but it needs work and before anything else is done, the proposal should be publicised in the magazine, followed by a public meeting.

- 3. Western Power had made a site visit to the Playing Field regarding the removal of the electricity shed. 3 4 weeks notice would be required for any alteration and the box can be fitted to a board fixed between two posts. The cost for Western Power to temporarily disconnect the supply is £399.50 and the Parish Council would have to employ an electrician to do the work. Cllr Cluney will check whether the board and posts must be made of wood or whether they can be metal. If wood, then metal post holders will be sunk to prolong the life of the posts. Cllr May and Cllr Cluney will contact local electricians. This will be reviewed at the next meeting.
- 4. A Land Registry map of Box Tree Cottage had been obtained and this shows that land to the front of the cottage is not owned by anyone and is therefore public land. After discussion, it was agreed that the Clerk would respond to the most recent email from the owners, confirming that there is no ownership and that access and use by the public will continue as previously.
