Cllr Chopak reported that Cornwall Council had received 270 calls about water related incidents in the recent bad weather. Bude was on flood alert. She pointed out the importance of councils having an Emergency Plan.

She also spoke about Cornwall Council's budget issues. They thought they had a balanced budget, but have in fact overspent by another 7 million pounds. More savings will be sought elsewhere. She said we will see significant cuts between now and April.

The crematorium plans were quashed at judicial review. This means that the planning application can start again.

Treetops – tree surgeons had attended the site to take some trees down. She said reports were coming to the end of their life. She expected that at the December of January meeting, the applicant could come back with revised plans.

She has written to English Heritage over concerns raised regarding Penhallam. No reply, but she will chase. 23/265

- 4. Bottom part of the playing field

All councillors apart from ClIrs Bolt and Richardson attended a recent site meeting at the playing fields. The path will go around the top field, keeping to the playing field side of the tennis courts to avoid water pipes. It will continue past the tennis courts along the bottom field fence to the right-hand side, behind the right-hand goal posts to join up with the bottom path. The football club raised concern about the safety of a ball straying. If this becomes an issue, the parish council will work with the football club. Councillors were pleased to see how the bottom area is developing. Questions over drain work and plainings – ClIr Chopak will look into. ClIr Peters to look into the lifespan of the footpaths.

Cllr Peters gave an update on the progress of the footpath project. The next stage will be a formal invitation to tender. A questionnaire to villagers will be drafted and put in the magazine. He was thanked for his work with the project.

5. Week St Mary Parish Hall

A letter was sent to the parish council from the Parish Hall committee regarding a regular shortfall in funds, with a request for the parish council to increase its yearly payment. This letter was read to councillors at the meeting by Cllr Johns. She said, due to the increased cost of living, bookings for parties etc have dropped off. A new boiler will cost in the region of £20K. She said it would be a shame for the hall to get into financial trouble and have to close. The committee has applied for a grant and has sent letters to people in the village. They intend to apply for a National Lottery grant and will be attending the meeting in Launceston about the Levelling Up fund. Cllr Johns left the room while the council discussed the matter.

Cllr May said the council was very sympathetic and did not want to lose the hall. Cllr Stephens suggested that the hall give a presentation to the council in the form of a business plan. Cllr Slade said the hall has tried to increase the hire cost, but they want people to use it. She said they were also desperate for committee members. Cllr Peters suggested that they ask the hall committee to come back to the council in December with a concrete plan.
