# **Week St Mary Parish Council**

# Minutes - Thursday, April 4, 2024

- 1. **Public question time** (15 minutes allowed for this – on matters on the agenda only) A number of residents spoke on the Ashbury Grove correspondence from Cornwall Council. One called it a total debacle. They recalled that in 2006 as a parish council, it was mooted that Pearce Construction were to pay £24,000 for the upkeep of the oblong area. The parish council said go for that, but they were trumped by North Cornwall District Council at the time who said they will have it and do it. Then NCDC became Cornwall Council. He thought in that period, Pearce did not pay £24K, but they did. He is in agreement that if ownership is not taken over by Cornwall Council, the £24K or pro rata sum will have to be paid back to Pearce Construction. Another resident did not read the correspondence as such, and felt that Cornwall Council was obliged to take it over. He said Cornwall Council is acknowledging that the cost to maintain it will be £1,333 a year but are trying to dump it on the parish council without giving any money for the ongoing upkeep. One spoke about the tone of Cornwall Council's letter, and said the residents have not been afforded the time or opportunity to give anything due consideration. The feelings of residents have not been canvassed. Cllr Chopak said not enough information has been provided and she has asked for some more time.
